25.84 Review of Correspondence Received

25.84.1 All correspondence had been circulated, including:

NYC – Cost of Living Campaign. This was now on the PC website.

St Lambert's Christmas Tree Festival – JJ read an email received from Mrs Belinda Collins.

25.85 Matters for Discussion

25.85.1 Resignation of JJ & Clerk

As discussed earlier, no one had come forward for either position. DW explained that if necessary, his position as NY Councillor could be co-opted onto the PC (minimum of 3 out of 5 councillors required for the PC to retain it's function) and that one councillor could be appointed as clerk/responsible financial person, if necessary. JJ encouraged all to be proactive in seeking prospective councillors

25.85.2 Public Bins

JJ reported that on 24 October 2025, following numerous reports sent to NYC by both the PC and residents, JJ & MH had emptied the overflowing litter and dog waste bins in the village, which had not been emptied since overflowing in August 2025. This action caught the attention of NYC and after many emails and calls, the waste was finally collected. NYC believed the refuse collectors were emptying these bins during the fortnightly black bin collections and were unaware of the numerous reports logged through the NYC website portal. The matter does now appear to have been addressed by NYC.

JJ also reported that recycling waste had not been collected from the end of Nipcroft Lane and when the omission was reported, NYC claimed no knowledge of a 45-year-old collection point. To be monitored.

25.85.3 CIL - Installation of Bus Stop/Shelter & Water Pump

JJ advised that NYC had still to move the bus stop to the agreed location. He also advised of a call from NYC to discuss the speed signpost, which needs straightening and more concrete around it's base. It is hoped that both jobs will be undertaken on the same day. JJ advised that discussions on spending CIL funds on a bus shelter and/or the water pump should await the completion of the works.

25.85.4 Footpaths

Still no update received from NYC regarding the cultivation of footpaths across Mr Dent's land. DW requested a copy of the email trail and agreed to follow up with NYC. JJ expressed the opinion that perhaps NY footpath officers lacked knowledge and understanding of legislation and laws regarding such matters.

25.85.5 Precept 2026-27

JJ presented the NY Precept Calculator Spreadsheet and highlighted the fact that the details indicate a reduction of 6 houses since the 2025-26 period. To be discussed with NYC. However, each councillor was asked their opinion and all agreed to leave the Precept at £3000 for 2026-27.

25.85.6 St Lambert's Christmas Tree Festival

A brief discussion took place. It was agreed to donate £25, equivalent of the entry fee.

25.85.7 NY Police Support

Mr Allan Skilbeck, a Police Support Volunteer had reached out on behalf of NY Police asking if he could attend a meeting to chat to residents. Agreed to extend an invitation to the January meeting.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 8.07 pm.
